Brief Recap

Part 1:

- Theseus is getting married to Hippolyta in the city Athens
- Suddenly, Egeus, father
 of Hermia, asks Theseus
 to tell his daughter to
 marry Demetrius
- However, Hermia does not love Demetrius, and instead loves Lysander

Part 2:

- Lysander and Hermia plan to flee Athens to get married
- Hermia tells her friend
 Helena about their plan,
 trusting her
- However, Helena, who is in love with Demetrius, decides to tell him about Hermia's plan

Time for an Activity!




Activity: "Father and Children"

Part 1:

- In another part of Athens,
 a group of average
 workers, known as the
 "Mechanicals", plan to
 put on a play at
 Theseus's wedding
- They decide to perform the play "The Most Lamentable Comedy and Most Cruel Death of Pyramus and Thisbe"

Part 2:

- Some of the actors include the weaver Nick Bottom, who wants to play all the parts, the carpenter Quince, who is in charge, and the weaver Snug, who is scared he cannot play the lion properly
- Note: All of these actors are men in Shakespeare!
